

Missionary Baptist Church Camp-Out 2026

General Information

- Schedule:** Registration will start at 3:00 pm on Monday, July 13th, and all campers must leave by noon on Friday, July 17th. A picnic-style dinner will be served in the evening, Monday through Thursday. Similarly, on Tuesday through Friday, a breakfast will be served in the morning. For all intents and purposes, the daily schedule will be flexible. Evening services will be at 7:00 pm, and we welcome any special music that campers wish to share. *(A CD player may be available for campers to use.)*
- Accommodations:** West Laverne Park includes 22 spaces for RVs or tents. Each space has hookups for water and electricity. No sewer hookup is available at the spaces, but there is a dump station on the grounds of the park. Church/family groups will be assigned neighboring spaces, to allow for self-supervision. You will need to be able to set up your own RVs or any tents brought with you. Youth staying in tents will be under the supervision of the church/family group that they are attending with. Restrooms, showers, gazebo, and an outdoor kitchen is available; and there will be designated area(s) for those who choose to smoke.
- Activities:** No segregated classrooms are being planned. There is a firepit, so it offers us a place for campfire singing, prayer circles and devotionals. If your church/family group would like to perform a skit, share a devotional, bring a special or provide a craft project *(instructions and all components)*, we encourage it and will make time for it. *(Note: A Coquille volunteer has supplies to do tie-dyed shirts. Those wishing to participate need to bring their own white, 100% cotton, T-shirt.)* Kids can enjoy a playground or ride their bikes if you choose to bring them. There is an open field nearby that can be used for other activities. If you have frisbees, or other equipment, feel free to bring it with you. Adults and youth can try their hand at fishing in the Coquille River *(requires a fishing license for anyone 12 years of age and older)* just be sure to bring whatever fishing gear you will need.
- Pets:** Pets are allowed by the park, but need to be under your control at all times. Regulations imposed by the Coos County Parks Dept. will be our guideline. If you have a dog that is prone to incessant barking, please leave them at home. The Coquille church will not be held responsible for any injuries caused by pets brought by campers.
- Visitors:** Parents, and other visitors, are welcome at Laverne Park at any time.
- Phones:** The cell phone reception is spotty at the park, but the Park Host does have a landline telephone in the event of an emergency situation.
- Money and Valuables:** We discourage campers from bringing large amounts of cash, electronic devices or other valuables. If campers have any such items, that they need secured for safe keeping, please have them address this issue with the church/family group they are attending with. The Coquille church will not be held responsible for any lost/damaged valuables that are kept by campers.

The Coquille church suggests that youth, under the age of 18, have the form completed and signed by a parent/guardian and provided to an appointed supervisor from the church group they are attending with. *(Note: The Coquille church will not be providing any form of insurance for medical emergencies. All attendees will be responsible for having their own private insurance.)*
